Our mission is to foster safety, well-being, and resilience throughout Kauai utilizing a multifaceted approach to address the absence of disaster shelters, a workforce crisis, and fostering public-private partnerships and community-driven solutions that can be replicated and sustained across Kauai and the state.

The remoteness of our state as a whole, and the isolation and access challenges for many of our communities, including the west and north sides of our own island of Kauai, necessitates proactive measures to enhance resilience. The proposed Kauai Resilience Center, with its innovative Monolithic Domes and comprehensive mission, stands as a beacon of hope and security. By addressing the urgent need for secure shelter, public health and safety needs, workforce development, and community-driven solutions, we will have started the process of mitigating our vulnerabilities to both nature and manmade disasters.





A SOLUTION FOR ALL; MONOLITHIC DOMES

At the core of our innovative approach are the Monolithic Domes, designed to be formidable structures against natural forces. Engineered to withstand winds of up to 290 mph, these domes provide a level of resilience that surpasses traditional construction methods. Moreover, their minimal maintenance requirements ensure longevity and efficiency, addressing the need for sustainable solutions in the face of potential disasters.





Built in record time, the Monolithic Domes not only offer superior durability but also outpace traditional construction methods in terms of speed. This rapid construction is crucial in the context of emergency preparedness, ensuring that the Kauai Resilience Center can be swiftly deployed to provide shelter and support in times of crisis.

DOME TWO:

VOCATIONAL TRAINING (STTEM FOCUS)

PURPOSE: Collaborate with partners for non-college degree careers starting at \$65,000 annually

- LOWER HALF: Workshop space, classrooms.
- UPPER HALF: Potentially workforce childcare for north shore parents, or parents who work on the north shore
- ADDITIONAL PURPOSE: Facilitate vocational training in science, technology, trades, engineering, and math




DOME THREE:
